Presenting Ross and Del Skyring

Ross's addiction to orchids began whilst living in the Redlands (Brisbane) as a youngster. As 'Fame Orchids nursery was nearby, Ross would take the opportunity to buy his mother an orchid on her birthday and special occasions. After his mother was settled into an aged care facility, Ross took over her plants and so it began. Ross remembers receiving good advice and purchasing great orchids from Lyle Salarzewski (Redland Orchid Nursery) at Victoria Point (sadly passed away).

In 2007 Ross and Dell relocated to Hervey Bay and so the interaction with Hervey Bay Orchid Society began. After visiting the HBOS Orchid Show held at PCYC Ross joined the Society and has been an enthusiastic member since. Ross fondly remembers the first Society Bus Trip he went on. This was to 'Wondai Orchid and Garden Show' and Ross really enjoyed the experience. Whilst on this trip he was approached by Daphne who increased his interest even further. (This has happened to a lot of us. Good on you Daph! – ED) Next thing you know, Ross is secretary of the Society, a position he held for 3 years under President Norm Sprenger and then Giles Blaber. Ross is still an active committee member and Assistant Secretary.

Ross would also like to mention that Les Napper has sold him quite a few orchids and given him much advice over the years since moving up to Hervey Bay.

Dell enjoys the beauty of orchids but is not quite so enthusiastic as Ross.

Ross is very keen on growing *Cattleya* species and hybrids but in later times has developed an interest in *Vanda* and *Dendrobium* orchids. (At which he does an excellent job- ED.)

Ross's backyard is dominated by an Orchid Shade house which he built himself out of safety fence wire panels and sundry enclosures for orchids but still he has an issue with not enough space to contain them all. Due to this lack of space, Ross has kindly donated several orchids to the HB Orchid House including a large specimen of *Laelia purpurata*, which, when in flower is a highlight of visiting those premises.

Ross has been quite successful in showing orchids at local shows and has been keen to share his knowledge on growing the *Cattleya* Alliance to those less informed.

Ross's tip for novice growers is- Fertilize regularly, using a good quality fertilizer with trace elements. Ross uses 'Peter's Cal Mag' from Fernlands. His orchid medium is 'Scoria, perlite, charcoal and good quality bark.

Well done Ross and Dell, keep up the good work.





Pathiopedilum Orchids

Paphiopedilums are fan shaped plants which produce flowers comprised of a usually largish dorsal segment, a prominent pouch from which they derive their common name and two petals which are held horizontally or else droop to some extent. In the famed *Paph sanderianum*, these petals can be as long as several feet. The synsepalum is the segment found behind the pouch and is a segment formed by the fusion of the lateral sepals. In addition, *Paphs* differ from other orchids in having 2 anthers carrying a sticky pollen paste rather than the typical pollinia masses. Each fan growth when mature, will produce a terminal inflorescence carrying one or more flowers. Paphiopedilums are derived from species found naturally in Asia and the Asia-Pacific region. There are about 90 to over 115 or so species.

Paphiopedilums come in many different varieties, some of which require special attention to their culture, but the vast majority can be managed successfully if basic universal cultural requirements are met. It is not absolutely critical that you need to know specific requirements of each species or hybrid, but of course, if you do supply the special treatment appropriate to each type, you will be rewarded with optimal results. The culture of these various types differ mostly in their desired temperature ranges for optimal growth and some peculiarities in their cultural management.
