Hervey Bay Orchid Society Member Profile

Presenting 'Terri Bade'

Terri began his long interest in orchids as a youngster, when, whilst growing up on the outskirts of Nambour he remembers going with his brothers to rescue native orchids which had been dislodged from fallen trees after storms therefore, there were always orchids in trees around his home. Terri's eldest brother joined Nambour Orchid and grew some hybrids in a shade house in their backyard and Terri would often venture in to look at the strange blooms. Terri moved to Townsville in 1979, to work and study at James Cook Uni. and then began his own fascination with orchids. He rescued a few scraggly Cattleya plants from Big W that were falling out of their pots and successfully got them healthy again. Most of them flowered and that is when he started to get interested in growing different types of orchids. Terri found that Vandas were the easiest to grow in that climate so off he went, often frequenting a couple of nurseries where he would spend his 'Allowance', mainly on small seedlings (especially if there were two plants in the same pot). Terri joined the Townsville Orchid Society around 1982 and was encouraged by the leader of the 'New Grower Group', he also enjoyed visiting the shade houses of experienced growers. By this stage his 'Allowance" for buying orchids didn't stretch as far as he was hoping, so after encouragement from a couple of experienced growers who were setting up their own flasking facilities, Terri decided to do the same, as a cheaper alternative to expanding his collection. Whilst in Townsville, Terri undertook the orchid judging classes and qualified as an AOC Judge not long before relocating to Hervey Bay in 1986 where he taught at the Senior College. Before leaving Townsville Terri bare-rooted his collection of orchids, packed them into about 30 polystyrene Broccoli cases and sent them by freight train to Maryborough where they spent 6 months under shade cloth draped over an old mango tree stump at his parents in-law place south of Maryborough. After a couple of moves to Hervey Bay residences, Terri and Carolyn have finally settled at Dundowran Beach where their orchids are happily becoming settled in newly constructed shade houses. Terri

joined the HBOS in 1986 and has been a very highly valued member ever since, including hosting

most IGG's, giving advice to new members and undertaking countless plant commentaries during our General meetings. Terri was also at the forefront when creating our displays at our many shows and is a major contributor in many other areas.

Terri was granted life membership of the HBOS about 12 years ago. (A title well earned. Ed)

Terri has been involved in his own extensive orchid breeding program and has had many orchids registered and awarded.

Terri's tip to novice growers is to tap into all available knowledge and don't be afraid to experiment.

Oncidium Alliance

Genus

Hailing from tropical America, the genus Oncidium belongs to the family Orchidaceae. The 650-odd species in the genus are epiphytic, lithophytic, and terrestrial multi-stemmed orchids. In general, these attractive orchids bear yellow and brown flowers on long branching inflorescences and are most eye-catching when in bloom, with the often large lip being the dominant feature. While this is a highly variable genus, the species all have a distinct pseudobulb, from which they bloom only once. Ranging in size from tiny to enormous plants, there is an oncidium for most situations in favourable conditions they thrive when mounted on cork slabs that allow their roots the freedom to develop, but smaller species are equally at home when potted to provide indoor colour.

Appearance

Oncidiums have clustered pseudobulbs that range from hard-to-find to large and conspicuous, each with up to 4 blunt-tipped strap-like leaves at the apex. The inflorescences generally appear from the leaf axil of recently matured growth and bloom only once from the pseudobulb. Most species have small yellow and brown flowers, some a little reminiscent of pansies, massed on wiry branching stems. Sometimes the sepals and petals are very much reduced, making the lip which usually has large lobes and may be multi-coloured the main feature.

Cultivation

This very complex genus is allied with other genera, such as Miltonia and Brassia, and intergeneric forms are common. Oncidium species and hybrids require bright conditions and winter lows of not less than 10°C. Most species can be grown mounted, and smaller species can be grown in pots. Plant in a bright but shaded position with coarse, very free-draining growing medium and allow to dry before watering. Propagation is by division.
